Graduation Rates

The federal government requires disclosure of graduation rates based upon completions by full-time, first-time-in-college students within three years (for two year programs) of initial enrollment. The National League for Nursing Accreditation Commission requires disclosure of graduation rates within three years of first enrollment in a nursing course. The Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science (GSC) rate is based upon completion of the program within six years of entry.
