Dual Enrollment FAQs

(1) What is *dual enrollment*?

- *Historically: created to allow high school students to enroll in college courses and receive college credit*
- *More recently: community colleges have created articulation agreements with other colleges so students can enroll simultaneously in two programs, such as an associate degree program at a community college and a bachelor's degree program at a 4-year college/university*

(2) What are the advantages to students?

- *Provides a seamless movement from associate to bachelor's degree*
- *Provides students with access to a greater number of course offerings*
- *Allows students to receive financial aid for both programs*

(3) How does dual enrollment work at GSC ?

- *AASN Students who intend to complete the BSN will be accepted to both the AASN and BSN programs*
- *Dual enrollees can take courses in both the AASN and BSN programs (only Gen Ed courses in the BSN) and receive financial aid for both*
- *Students who meet the admissions criteria* will receive final acceptance to the BSN program after they complete the AASN and are licensed as an RN*

(4) How does the College benefit from dual enrollment?

- *It allows us to remove financial barriers for students while maintaining compliance with regulations governing Title IV funds*
- *It makes efficient use of College resources*

(5) Which BSN courses can I take while I am participating in dual enrollment?

- *The following BSN general education courses can be taken by AASN/BSN dual enrollment students:*
 - *ENG 102, ENG 105, CS1 102, ETH 321, MTH 111, MTH 204, BIO 311*
(Check for pre- or co-requisite requirements)

(6) Am I a good candidate for dual enrollment?

- *AASN students with a 2.5 GPA and in good academic standing are eligible for dual enrollment*
- *Students with a high volume of transfer credits in the AASN program tend to have more time available to add BSN general education coursework*
