Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science is committed to safety and security on campus and is in compliance with the *Federal Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990, Higher Education Amendments of 1998 (HEA 98)*.

It is the goal of Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science to maintain a safe, secure and healthful work and learning environment for students, visitors and employees. The College recognizes and values the importance of a safe and secure educational environment. The College strives to provide an environment that fosters the opportunity and the freedom for the entire community to grow intellectually while in the pursuit of educational excellence.

Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science is a subsidiary corporation of Good Samaritan Hospital (a partner of TriHealth, Inc.). The College is located on the campus of the Good Samaritan Hospital. Access to the College is through the main entrances of Good Samaritan Hospital. Hours of operation are posted.

Security services are provided by the Good Samaritan Hospital Security Department. The Security Department of TriHealth is not a department of Good Samaritan College.

Hospital Security is located on Level 5 on the Clifton Avenue side of Good Samaritan Hospital. Security officers are available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. For non-emergencies, Hospital Security may be contacted by phone at (513) 862-2476 or from in-house phones at 22476.

If there is an emergency, contact Hospital Security by phone at (513) 862-3311 or by dialing 911 from in-house phones.

Reporting Information

All emergencies or unusual or suspicious activity should be reported immediately to the Good Samaritan Hospital Security Department or any designated campus official. Designated campus officials include Deans, Department Chairs, Professional Staff, and Advisors to students/student organizations. If reported to a designated campus official, the designated campus official will notify Hospital Security. After being notified of an emergency or an unusual or suspicious condition on campus, Hospital Security will dispatch the appropriate number of officers and emergency equipment to the scene. If Hospital Maintenance personnel are needed in an emergency, they will be contacted by Hospital Security. The Good Samaritan Hospital Security Department controls, monitors, and assesses security-related conditions of the physical plant, grounds, and equipment through building inspections, environmental rounds, and security inspections. Hospital Security officers have the authority to ask persons for identification and to determine whether individuals have lawful business at the College. Hospital Security officers have the authority to issue parking citations, but they do not have arrest powers. The Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science is a department under the authority of Good Samaritan Hospital Security.

All crimes occurring on campus should be reported immediately to Hospital Security or any designated campus official. If reported to a designated campus official, the designated campus official will notify Hospital Security. Hospital Security will prepare a report of the incident. While there is no formal memorandum of understanding, Hospital Security maintains a close professional and working relationship with the City of Cincinnati Police and Fire Departments and will notify them in instances where assistance is needed. If a report made to Hospital Security also involves a potential violation of the College's rules and regulations by a student, Hospital Security will notify the College Compliance Officer.

If a student or employee is the victim of a crime and do not want to pursue action, he/she may still want to consider making a confidential report. With the individual's permission, Hospital Security can file a report on the details of the incident without revealing their identity. The purpose of a confidential report is to comply with the individual's wish to keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to ensure the future safety of everyone. Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the annual crimes statistics for the College. Please note, however, that if a report involves what the College believes to be an ongoing or continuing threat, the College will be required to take steps to notify the College community of such threat.

The College encourages anyone who is the victim of or a witness to any crime to also immediately report (or permit the College to immediately report) that crime to the City of Cincinnati Police. Please note, however, that because police reports are public records under Ohio law, the College cannot guarantee that reports made to the City of Cincinnati Police will be held in confidence.

Counselors

The College provides its students with free access to a full-time Counselor for students seeking personal counseling. The purpose is to provide students overall support, advocacy, resources, and counseling to facilitate problem-solving and decision-making. While discussions with counselors are held in confidence, counselors may inform students of the College's procedures to report crimes on a voluntary, confidential basis for inclusion in the College's annual disclosure of crime statistics. A student's personally identifying information will not be included in the annual disclosure of crime statistics.

Good Samaritan College Emergency Communication Plan

The Good Samaritan College Emergency Communication Plan may be activated if appropriate. The Good Samaritan College Emergency Communication Plan involves notification from the Hospital Security to the College Operations Manager if an immediate threat is posed to the health and/or safety of the students. The College Operations Manager will then immediately notify all faculty, staff, and students through either text message or email message that a "Red Alert" which may impact College safety or security has been activated.

If needed, the Good Samaritan College Emergency Response Team (ERT) will be utilized. The Good Samaritan College Emergency Response Team involves the coordination of numerous departments throughout the College. Depending upon the circumstances, one or more of the various departments throughout the College will be notified and tasked with responding to the incident. The College Operations Manager will act as the liaison and coordinator of the Good Samaritan College Emergency Response Team. Additional information is located in the College's Emergency Communication Plan policy.

Services Provided by the Hospital Security Department

Some of the services provided by the Security Department include:

- Crime Prevention Programs
 - Information regarding the College's crime prevention programs is made available through a variety of means including but not limited to the student newsletter, electronic monitors, emails and student orientation and programs throughout the year.
- Issuance of College ID Badges
 - College ID Badges are issued by TriHealth Security.

- Assistance with vehicle and parking safety
 - The College offers assistance with vehicle and parking safety. If a student feels that he or she is in need of this service, he or she should contact Hospital Security at 513-862-2476.
- 24-hour escort service
 - The College offers a 24-hour escort service. If a student feels that he or she is in need of this service, he or she should contact Hospital Security at 513-862-2476. A member of Hospital Security will be available to drive the student to or from his or her vehicle.
- Electronic Surveillance and Monitoring
 - Specific areas of the College are monitored by the Hospital Security Department.

Safety Programs

During student orientations at the beginning of the Fall and Spring semesters, students are informed of services offered by Hospital Security. Security also offers information at the College Fair twice a year. Students are also routinely informed and reminded of ways to maintain personal safety. Similar information is presented to new employees. Student safety information is communicated to students via Sonisweb announcements, student email messages, the weekly student newsletter, and electronic bulletin boards located in common areas on the campus. Communications to employees are made via the College-wide email system or the Good Samaritan Hospital Intranet. In addition, each student has access to the College Web site where additional safety and security information is located. Pamphlets and other literature regarding safety and security are also located in the 8th Floor lounge area.

Published Report on Campus Statistics of Criminal Activities

The College's annual published report on campus statistics of criminal activities will include statistics for the three most recent calendar years concerning an occurrence on campus or on public property within or immediately adjacent to or accessible from the College's campus of the following that are reported to local police agencies, Hospital Security, and designated campus officials: criminal homicide (murder and manslaughter), sex offense (forcible and non-forcible), robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft, arson, liquor law violations, drug law violations, illegal weapons violations, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking. In addition to the foregoing, statistics regarding incidents of theft, assault, intimidation, or vandalism that is perceived to have been motivated by the victim's race, gender, gender identity, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity, national origin, or disability will also be published in the report.

The personally identifying information of the victim or the person accused of the committing the crime will not be included in this published report.

The College may withhold, or subsequently remove, a reported crime from its crime statistics only in the rare situation where sworn or commissioned law enforcement personnel have fully investigated the reported crime and, based on the results of this full investigation and evidence, have made a formal determination that the crime report is false or baseless.

An email notification is sent annually to all enrolled students, faculty, and staff providing a link to the College's website where students may access this report. Copies of the report may also be obtained from the College's website, the Campus Operations and Security Manager's Officer (Room 872.23), or by calling 513-862-3188.

General Faculty and Staff Safety Responsibilities

- Assume primary responsibility for personal safety;
- Each employee has the responsibility to prevent accidents and injuries by observing established operating rules;
- Report safety concerns and potential hazards promptly either by work order or directly to the Security Department
- Wear Identification Badge at all times.

General Student Safety Responsibilities

- Assume primary responsibility for personal safety;
- Each student has the responsibility to prevent accidents and injuries by observing established operating rules;
- Report safety concerns or potential hazards promptly to Good Samaritan Hospital Security Department or any designated campus official.
- When participating in laboratory activities, receive the appropriate lab safety training prior to lab participation and use appropriate required personal protective equipment and safety instruments and tools;
- Check College-assigned student e-mail accounts regularly for information on security and safety incidents that may be affecting the College community.
- Wear Identification Badge at all times.

Alcohol and Drugs

The use of, sale, manufacture, possession, or distribution of intoxicating beverages and illegal and/or certain controlled substances is governed by state and federal law as well as the College's Alcohol and Drug policy. It is unlawful to sell, furnish or provide alcohol to a person under the age of 21. The possession of alcohol by anyone under the 21 years of age in a public place or a place open to the public is illegal.

Anyone using alcohol or drugs on campus or under the influence during class or clinical hours will be reported to the Dean of Student/Alumni Services and referred to the college counseling service. The identity of the individual making the report will be kept confidential. The information will be thoroughly investigated before official action is taken. A drug screen performed by the Employee Health Department may be required. Disciplinary action will be on an individual basis. When appropriate, legal authorities will be notified.

The College conducts a minimum of one annual workshop related to alcohol and drug education. Pamphlets and educational material related to substance abuse will be available on a continual basis.

Sexual Misconduct, Dating Violence, Domestic Violence, and Stalking

The intent of this information is public safety and awareness and is made available to alert possible victims of potential danger, not to punish or embarrass offenders. This information is not to be used in any other fashion or for any other purpose.
